

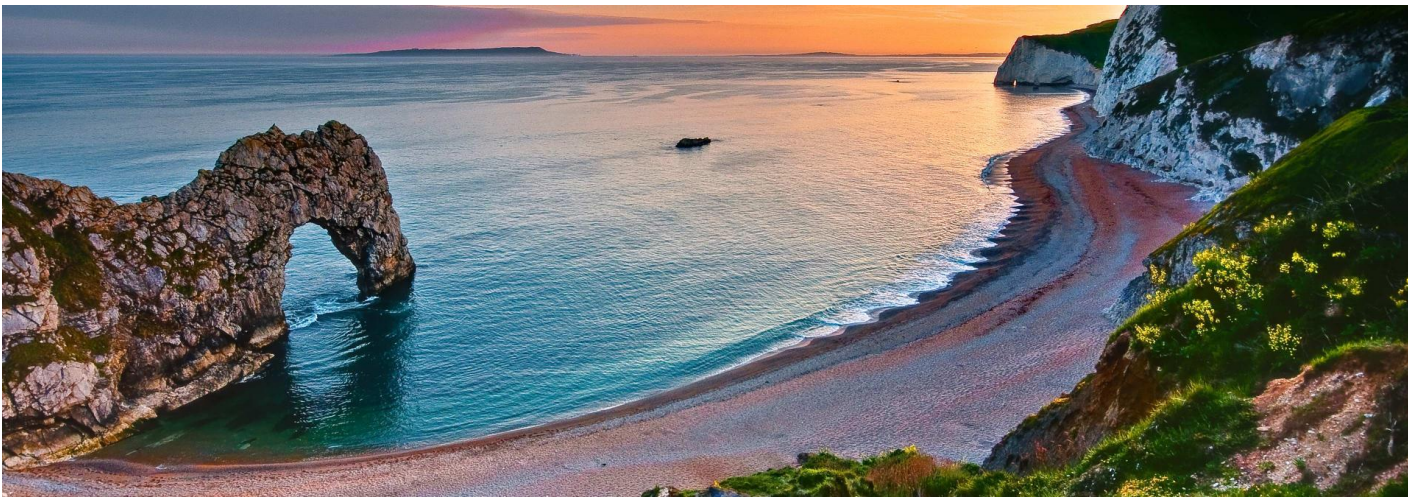

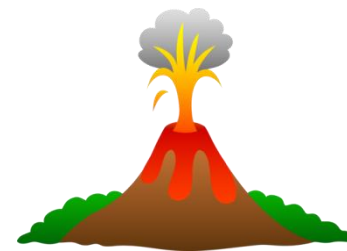




# Paper 1: Living with the physical environment



Worth 35% of the GCSE  
1 hour 30 minute exam



There are 3 sections:

- Section A: Natural hazards (tectonic hazards, tropical storms, extreme weather in the UK)
- Section B: Physical landscapes in the UK (Rivers and Coasts)
- Section C: The living world (tropical rainforests and cold environments)





# Paper 2: Challenges in the human environment

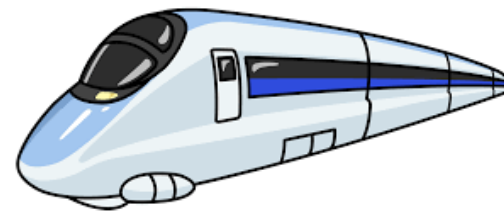


Worth 35% of the GCSE  
1 hour 30 minute exam



There are 3 sections:

- Section A: Urban issues and challenges (regeneration, transport issues)
- Section B: The changing economic world (population, tourism)
- Section C: The challenge of resource management (food, water or energy)

Worth 30% of the GCSE  
1 hour exam

This unit aims to test your ability to think critically and solve problems.

- You will take part in two fieldtrips to collect primary data. You will then answer questions about this in the exam.

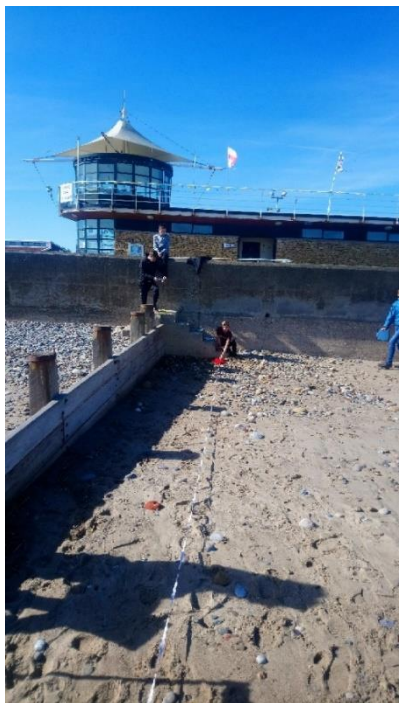

1/4	6cm	105cm	99cm
Half way	39cm	121cm	82cm
3/4	68cm	143cm	75cm

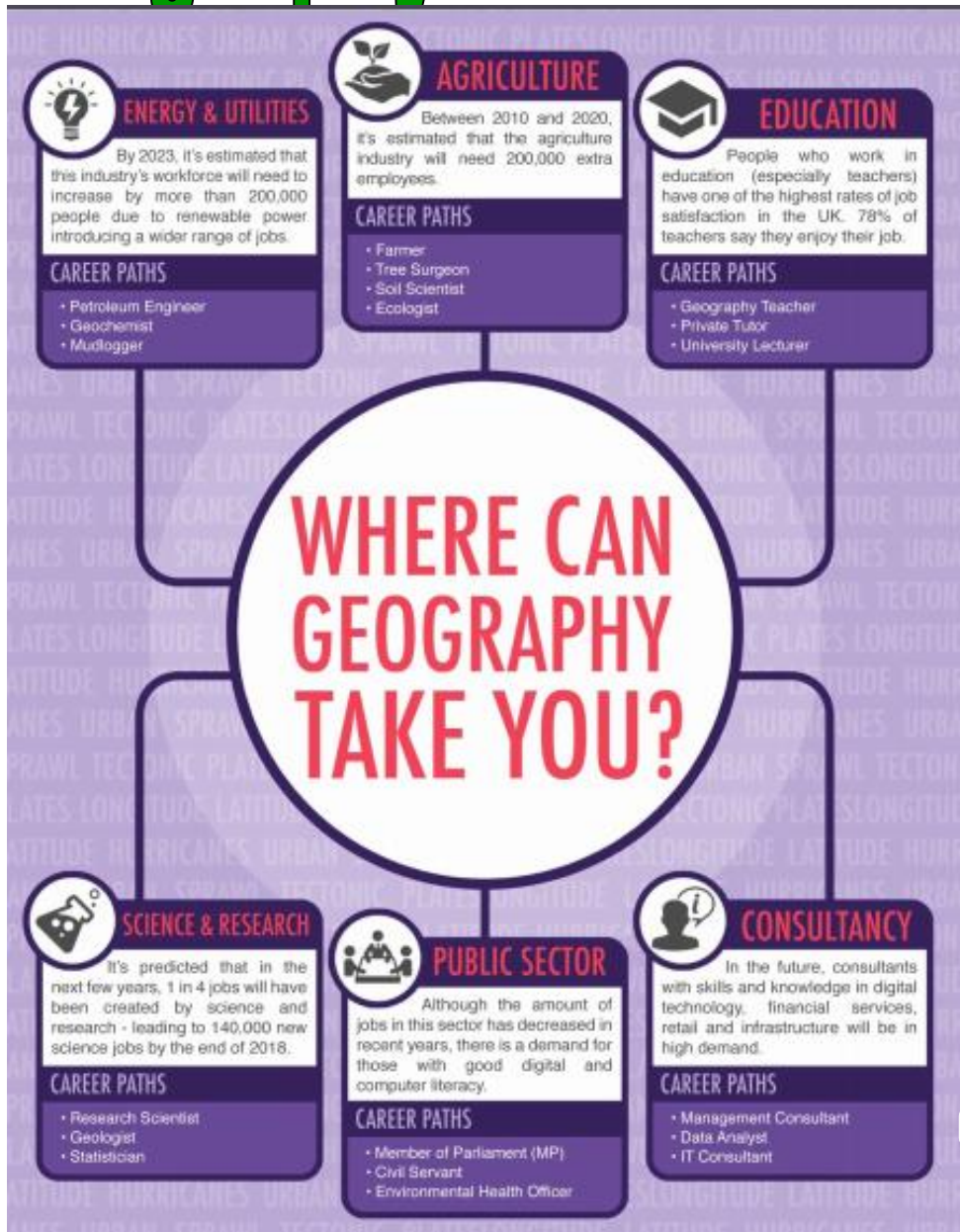
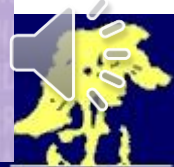
# Where will Geography take me?
